Bein live tv guide

If you want to watch live TV on your Apple TV — cable or antenna — it's relatively easy to set up and get going. The great thing about streaming set-top boxes is that almost everything you need to watch content is available in one place... with the exception of live television. You can download the network of the appropriate app to watch the live stream of your channel, but you usually need a cable subscription to make it possible, which negates the entire point of cutting the cable in the first place. However, with Apple TV and an app called Channels, you can get a live TV — complete with a cable episode guide — right in the same interface as all your streaming apps. What you need RELATED: How to get HD TV channels for free (without paying for cable) For this process, you'll need an HDHomerun (a device we've covered in the past) along with a TV antenna (free over-the-air TV from networks like NBC, ABC, CBS, etc.) or a cable box (which will offer you many more channels like ESPN, TBS and so on). Of course, you can watch live TV without HDHomerun - using an antenna or cable operator - but it requires constant switching between inputs on the TV every time you want to watch TV. If you want to connect it to your Apple TV, you'll need an HDHomerun. HDHomerun is an external TV tuner that connects to a home network. From there, you can watch live TV from any device in your home if it's connected to a network and the device has an app that can pick up live TV from a tuner. There are three versions of HDHomerun: Connect (\$110), Extend (\$180) and Prime (\$135). Prime supports cable cabinets (and cable enclosures only), while the other two are designed for TV antennas. Connect and Extend are very similar, except the connect model requires an 802.11ac router to watch live TV over Wi-Fi, while Extend requires only an 802.11n router. Most newer routers today use 802.11ac as well, so feel free to go with Connect if your router supports 802.11ac. It's cheaper than the Extend, which is nice (although the Extend comes with a newer design without a fan). Step one: Connect hdHomerun To install HDHomerun, you'll need a device, its power cord, Ethernet cable (included) and tv antenna or cable box. For this manual I use the Antenna I Can Leaf. NOTE: If you have a cable, you will almost certainly need to contact your cable service provider and let them install the cablecard in your HDHomerun as well, since the vast majority of cable channels are encrypted. Once you have everything you need, simply connect the HDHomerun to the power supply, connect the TV antenna or cable box to the device's coaxial connector, and use an Ethernet cable to connect the HDHomerun to the empty Ethernet port on the router. From there, the device will start automatically and be ready to be available. Step two: Install the Channels Next app, install Channels on Apple TV. You can also download it to your iPhone or iPad. The Apple TV TV it costs \$25 (\$15 for the iOS version), making it one of the most expensive apps in the App Store. But since the app also gives you a cable TV guide on the screen, the price is definitely worth it. After you download and install the app on your Apple TV, open it and automatically recognize the hdHomerun on your network. You can confirm this by selecting Settings at the top. From there, your hdhomerun tuner will appear on the screen along with a list of channels that your antenna has grabbed. How to use Channels App Overall, the Channels app is pretty basic, but that's a good thing. At the top, you can either choose On Now or Guide. On Now shows you what's on TV right now and displays it all with large thumbnails (pictured above). Selecting the Wizard will provide you with a familiar interface where you can view what's on TV now, as well as see what's airing later. When you select something to watch, you will be immediately taken to this channel. You'll also see a bush bar at the bottom that tells you what a TV show is, as well as what's airing later off on the right. Channels let you pause and rewind live TV, and there's a DVR feature that lets you record what you want so you can watch later. However, the DVR feature is currently still in beta and costs \$8 per month. Keep in hand that HDHomerun works with any device if you can get an app for it that lets you watch live TV through a tuner. This means that you can use it not only with channels, but VLC, Kodi, and even HDHomerun custom applications that you can get for Windows or Mac. Hulu + Live TV is an extension of hulu's existing on-demand service, which adds live tv broadcasting to the mix. The biggest difference between Hulu with Live TV and other streaming services is that Hulu provides access to a massive library of on-demand content, and the biggest difference between Hulu and cable is that for Hulu to work, you need to have a high-speed Internet connection and compatible device instead of just a TV. If you watch any on-demand TV shows or movies online, there's a good chance you're already familiar with Hulu. The service has been around for a long time, and offers access to a huge library of on-demand content from ABC, NBC, CBS, Fox, and many other networks, in addition to exclusive content that you can't get anywhere else. Hulu with Live TV is a subscription option that allows Hulu subscribers to access live TV streaming through the same platform. With this service, you can watch live TV on your desktop or laptop, smartphone or tablet, or even on your TV if you have a compatible device. Although Hulu with Live TV offers an alternative to expensive cable subscriptions, it also has a number of competitors that also offer live TV streaming online. Sling TV, YouTube TV, Vue and DirecTV Now all offer different levels of live TV Other services, such as CBS All Access, also allow viewers to watch live TV online at a more limited capacity. For those who prefer the type of on-demand content that Hulu is most well known for, services like Netflix and Amazon Prime Video also offer shows and movies that are available for streaming at any time. Signing up for Hulu with Live TV is a pretty easy process, and it's even easier if you already have a Hulu account. If you don't already have a Hulu account, here's how to sign up for Hulu with Live TV: Go to hulu.com. Click to run the free trial. This option is available only if you don't already have a Hulu subscription. Search for Hulu with live TV, and then click Select. To use your Facebook credentials to create an account, click Continue with Facebook, or enter your information, slide down, and click Continue. Enter your credit card information, and then click Send. If you already have a Hulu subscription, adding live TV is even easier: Go to hulu.com and sign in to your account if you're not already signed in. Click to get live TV. Select one of the plans that contains live TV, click the schedule, and then click Continue. Enter your zip code, and then click Continue. There are two Hulu with Live TV plans, and both come with the same basic channels and most of the same features. The main difference between the two plans is that one of them adds live TV services to its Hulu subscription, and the other adds live TV and also removes ads from almost all on-demand content on the web. Hulu's live TV plans are: Hulu with Live TV: it includes access to 50+ live TV channels, and access to Hulu's entire on-demand library through its limited advertising plan. Hulu (No Commercials) with Live TV: includes access to 50+ live TV channels, and access to Hulu's entire on-demand library through their no ads plan. Channel availability varies depending on your physical location. Check out Hulu's search tool to see the exact channels that you'll be able to watch via Hulu with Live TV. Choosing a live TV plan from Hulu is easier than it is with most other services because there is only one factor you really need to consider. If you watch a lot of on-demand streaming content, and you don't like that your shows are split into ads, then no ad plan is a good deal. If you don't care about on-demand content, then a cheaper limited ads plan is a better option. Streaming services like Hulu limit the number of shows you can watch at once, using the same account, on different devices. Each show is referred to as a stream because the show is watched through streaming. A regular Hulu subscription allows only one stream, but Hulu with Live TV bumps that up to two simultaneous streams. This that you can watch a live or on-demand show on your computer, and someone else can watch another show on your phone using the same account. If you require the ability to watch more than two shows at once, Hulu with Live TV offers that as an optional accessory. Hulu is able to reduce the quality of video stream based on viewer quality internet speed, so it is possible to watch shows on Hulu without much internet. If you encounter a playback error with Hulu, it's usually easy to fix. However, Hulu does recommend some minimum download speeds if you want to experience the best possible image quality: On-demand shows and movies: 1.5+ Mbps for standard video resolution, and 3+ Mbps for high definition video. Live TV: 8+ Mbps for one stream and additional bandwidth to display multiple streams. Both Hulu's live TV plans come with 50+ channels and digital video recorder (DVR) features, but you can pay extra to get access to multiple channels and features. Here are important add-ons and other channel packages that you can add to your Hulu subscription with Live TV: Enhanced Cloud DVR: Drastically increases the amount of content you can save to your cloud DVR, and adds the ability to skip ads while watching content you've recorded. Unlimited screens: Removes the limit on how many streams you can watch at once. The normal limit is two screens, and this option allows you to watch on an unlimited number of devices in your home location and up to three mobile devices at once. Showtime: Adds up to eight live Showtimes channels depending on location, including broadcasts on the East and West Coasts, if available. Includes access to the full Showtime content library on demand. Cinemax: Adds up to seven live Cinemax channels, including broadcasts on both the East and West Coasts, if available. Includes access to Cinemax content on demand. HBO: Adds up to seven live HBO channels, including broadcasts on both the East and West Coasts, if available. Includes access to HBO NOW for HBO content on demand. Once you've signed up, watching live TV on Hulu is very easy: Go to hulu.com. Click LIVE TV. Click Guide, or move the mouse cursor to the left side of the screen. The availability of live TV on Hulu depends on your physical location. Click the channel you want to watch. Hulu with Live TV offers a cloud DVR feature that lets you record shows and watch them later. Because it's cloud-based, you don't have to worry about filling your computer's hard drive. You can also record on any device and then watch recordings on any other device. The default cloud DVR included in both Hulu's Live TV plans offers a limited amount of storage space, and ads cannot be skipped. If you want to record more hours of live TV and skip ads, you can upgrade to the enhanced Cloud DVR feature. Hulu is one of the pioneers in online streaming, so its massive on-demand content library is one of Hulu's strongest selling points with Live TV. When you sign up for one of the Hulu with Live TV subscription plans, you can also get access to on-demand content from all major broadcast networks, a huge slate of cable networks, and also exclusive shows like Journey and Handmaid's Tale, which you can only watch on Hulu. Hulu With Live TV also provides access to hulu's huge on-demand library. Some shows are available in full, with each episode of each season available for streaming at any time. Other shows that are still in the air usually available on demand within a day to a week of broadcast. Hulu's Live TV No Commercials plan allows you to watch most of Hulu's on-demand TV shows and movies without commercial breaks, but a handful of shows are still presented with a limited number of ads due to contractual obligations. Unlike some other streaming platforms, Hulu does not offer movie rentals. The service includes a large library of movies on demand, and the cloud-based DVR feature also allows you to record movies and watch them later. You can't rent movies from Hulu, but your subscription provides access to a library of movies and on-demand trailers. If you want to rent newer movies that aren't yet available through Hulu, it's better to go through a service like Sling, Vudu, Amazon or iTunes. iTunes.
